Laytown Village Enhancement

aytown Village Enhancement Com-Limittee are delighted with the fresh planting that we have been able to provide at the Memorial Garden (former Library Site), The project was part funded by a Community Grant from Meath County Council with the balance being met out of our own resources. The planting was undertaken under contract by John Lynch and his team from Elite Landscaping. The involvement of residents of Marian Villas is also a great omen for the future protection of this garden and its amenities. In particular their willingness to keep the plants well irrigated will mean that this and future planting will be protected and will flourish.

We have been approved by Enterprise Ireland to commission a feasibility study into the possibility of providing an enterprise centre in the locality and work will begin shortly in sourcing a suitable building which could be adapted into such a centre. Such a centre could provide much needed employment opportunities. The hope is that this could be undertaken in conjunction with the very successful Mill Enterprise Centre in Drogheda. Anybody with ideas or owners of buildings which might meet the criteria should contact a member of our committee with information

We are also working with a number of other local organisations and have been approved to get a local Community Employment Scheme under the auspices of the Department of Social Protection. The

scheme will provide workers for local community projects. More information will be provided on this later once all documentation has been put in place.

We are also pleased that Meath County Council has included our proposal for an inter-generational park beside the current playground as a significant project under the Village Amenities Programme. We are keeping our fingers crossed that the Department will approve this application.

In order to meet the matching funds costs of all these programmes we will be seeking public support for a number of fundraising initiatives as we cannot continue to bring such projects to fruition unless we have local support to provide muchneeded funds.

One big concern at the moment relates to the lack of decision-making by An Bord Pleanala to our submission regarding the ALDI Planning application. Local opposition to this planning proposal was clearly evident at the public meeting which we organized last January. Subsequently we employed the services of Town Planner Nic de Jong and Associates who prepared our submission, In the most recent letter from An Bord Pleanala to our Secretary John Higgins, received on 28th June states "I regret to inform you that the Board will

not now be in a position to determine the appeal before that date (28th June),. An Inspector's Report has been received and the file is at Board level. The continuing delay is due to necessity for further consideration at Board level".

Full Council July 3rd, 2017

rts funding Awards and Bursaries 2017 were announced.
Glad to see Scoil an Spioraid Naomh and Gaelscoil an Bhradáin Feasa were two lucky recipients of these. The monies are to go towards school musical instrument purchase schemes.

Housing

The 16 new houses in Bettystown are now allocated to tenants. It may only be 16 but it's 16 families housed in secure homes. Not enough, by far, but it's a start. Phase 2 is due to start shortly and between Meath County Council and the housing agencies, acquisition of more houses is ongoing.

Iarnrod Eireann gave us a presentation on Changing Customers needs. The issues raised in connection with the Meath Coast area were the cost difference in fares between Balbriggan to Drogheda

including all stations in between. The need for car parking facilities at Laytown was raised and requested to look into this issue urgently. Cost of unused Gormanston car park and issues pertaining to commuters parking along the roadside was also raised. Removing the charges, just like Dunboyne station, has been requested. We'll wait and see what happens!

Municipal District July 13th, 2017

This was a very brief meeting as the launch of the Duleek and Donore CCTV was scheduled for the same morning.

It was great to hear that, finally, the footpath between the educational campus and Bettystown is to be started.

Not before time!!

For those attending Gormanston College, the footpath to the college is to be completed by the start of school term in September.

The council had been threatened with legal action by a company in Julianstown for its failure to put the site of the Old Mill Hotel on the derelict sites register, despite having declared it derelict in 2008. Residents have been complaining to the council and public representatives about the

Blue Birds - More than 90% of gardens enjoy regular visits from Blue Tits, making them the most common small bird to be seen on feeders or bird tables. They have blue caps, wings and tails, a green black and a yellow breast and underparts. A distinctive black 'robber's mask' runs from the base of the bill, obscuring the eyes. The sexes are almost impossible to separate, but the males usually have slightly brighter blue on the wings and crown. Juveniles have a more 'washedout' plumage with the face and underparts being the same pale-yellow colour. If you put out a new feeder, the chances are the first bird to use it will be a Blue tit.

Stamullen CFR Group Update

It's been a busy time for the Stamullen Community First Responders. The group have been running regular training scenarios in the Village over the past number of months in preparation for going live with the Health Service Executive (HSE) and the National Ambulance Service (NAS).



We are delighted to announce that we are now live and in position to respond to emergency situations in coordination with HSE Ambulance Control and the NAS.

From now on when a 999 or 112 call comes in from within 3km of Stamullen Village relating to heart attack, cardiac arrest, choking or stroke the HSE will dispatch an ambulance and at the same time contact the First Responders!

With 70% of cardiac arrests occurring within the home, the response of the local CFR group is crucial, as they can get to the patient very quickly and provide the initial care which increases the patient's chances of survival

The launch of the group is the culmination of a lot of preparation and training with group co-ordinator Warren Stott and group secretary Áine Walker working tirelessly to bring it to fruition. Over the last six months alone, Warren has trained over 20 people to cardiac first response level in addition to carrying out several cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) demonstrations for local school and community groups.



Fundraising and sponsorship has been vital to the success of the responders, with Meath County Council providing financial assistance and the Bank of Ireland sponsoring the groups 'on call' automatic external defibrillator (AED). The group are also thankful to Atomic Fitness whose fundraising campaign provided the funds



for the purchase and installation of the village defibrillator located at the Parish Hall. The group would also like to thank Dee's barber shop and St Patricks Church & Parish Hall for allowing us the use of their premises for indoor training.

The Tara Brooch

The Tara Brooch was found on Bettystown Strand in August 1850.

A ccording to the story, a 'poor' woman and her two sons were out gathering driftwood for fuel when they found it in a box buried in the sand. The woman took it to a scrap dealer in Drogheda but it was of no interest to him. She then brought it to a watchmaker in the town who, after cleaning and examining it, gave her 18 pence for it, about €10 in today's money. He in turn sold it to G & S Waterhouse Jewelers, Dublin, for £12, about €1,500 today.

A Celtic Revival had started in the 1840's and by 1850 was in full swing. Celtic art, songs, language and traditions were becoming increasingly popular, especially among the middle classes. George Waterhouse, owner of Waterhouse Jewelers, was one of the people responsible for it. He had been producing jewelry inspired by Celtic styles for some time, and had a very good reputation.

Waterhouse had the brooch examined by the Royal Irish Academy, which included George Petrie, the leading Irish antiquarian at the time, who dated it to the 8th century (700AD). Not one to miss a marketing opportunity Waterhouse named it the Tara Brooch, linking it with the High Kings of Ireland, even though it had nothing to do with Tara!

The centre piece of Waterhouse's Dublin shop display for 22 years, people visited in droves — even Queen Victoria wanted to see it, and requested it be sent to Windsor Castle for inspection. It was featured in the Great Exhibition in London in



1851, where Queen Victoria herself purchased a replica by Waterhouse, giving it a 'royal' endorsement. It also featured in the Exposition Universelle in Paris, and an exhibition in Dublin in 1853, where Queen Victoria came to see it again.

In 1872 it was acquired for £200, about €20,000 in today's money, by the Royal Irish Academy, the organisation responsible for setting up what is now the National Museum of Ireland, where it can still be seen to this day. §

Ice Cream Cone Cupcakes

A regular recipe made extra fun, something the kids can do with just a little help from the parents.

All Caoimhe's Crumbles recipes are adapted for children, easy reading, and easy following so they can be the main baker in the house.

Ice cream cone cupcakes, make a fantastic bake during our summer camps; one which happened in July and the next on August 10th to 12th; places are still available, costing €70. Everything is provided in the class and all bakes are brought home with recipes so the children can show off all their new skills.

Recipe makes 8

Ingredients for the cake mix:

110g margarine

110g castor sugar

110g self raising

2 eggs

Ingredients for buttercream:

125g unsalted butter

250g icing sugar

25g milk



All else needed:

8 Flat based ice cream cones A mini cupcake tray A piping bag sprinkles

Method:

- 1. Mix all the cake mix ingredients together to form a batter with no lumps.
- 2. Evenly spoon the mixture into each ice cream cone resting in the cupcake tray. Add one spoon into each cone at a time, and back track until all the mix is gone.
- **3.** Adult part: place in the oven and bake for 15 minutes at 180°c.
- **4. Adult part:** with an electric beater, beat the buttercream until light; put in a piping bag.
- 5. When the cupcakes are cool pipe the buttercream on top in a swirl and finish with sprinkles.

In y mother swears she can't breathe properly unless she is somewhere near the sea. As soon as she was able to we moved to live beside it and as soon as I was able to, I did the same. I can climb dunes, bury people in sand, build a sand-castle, paddle, and collect shells like a pro. I almost always go on holidays to a beach as well so it's a bit of a mystery to me why I can't sunbathe properly.

What would you do to save over €3500 a year?

The Central Bank of Ireland recently announced that there are over 100,000 households with mortgages, who could get a better deal by simply switching their mortgage. What most banks rely on is that people will not want to have to go through the hassle of switching, but have you really considered enquiring about reducing your monthly mortgage cost?

Example:

If we use a mortgage of $\[\in \] 240,000$ on a house worth $\[\in \] 300,000$ (80% Loan to Value) and a variable rate of 4.5%, the rough cost of interest payments per year is $\[\in \] 10,800$. Is there a lot of work involved?

In this regard, the real question you should ask is "am I prepared to put in a little work getting documents together to make monthly savings on our mortgage?". Your mortgage provider is hoping that you are prepared to pay more to avoid the hassle involved in switching to a cheaper provider.

Isn't there a huge cost involved?

There are costs involved but the main costs are usually the legal ones. Some mortgage



providers now cover up to €2,000 of potential legal costs. This would make the process far less costly. But even if you had to cover the entire legal fees, if you were saving over €2,000 a year, it would still be a cost saving exercise.

Can I make any other savings?
